

Scam Alert!

We want members to be aware of scammers that are lurking around every corner! Do not give personal information (including card and account numbers) over the phone or internet if you are not sure of the authenticity of who you are common scams speaking with. Here some that are circulating to watch out for. are Personal data, including social security number, addresses and account numbers are the type of information thieves try to steal from you. Scammers then trade information through black markets to use in future identity theft operations. Criminals will use stolen identities in order to obtain credit cards, fake mortgages, loans, and cash advances. Once an identity theft occurs, it is very difficult to undo the damage. It often costs thousands in legal fees just to clean up the mess created by these criminals. Be aware of how thieves try to steal information.
